'Sports Enrichment Week' is a chance for all children in Key Stage 2 to try out new sports and activities that they may not have experienced before.

The aim of the enrichment week is to show pupils what different sports are available to them in the local area that they could choose to take up as an extra-curricular activity outside of school.

On the back of letter you will find a list of activities that we have organised for this year's 'Sports Enrichment Week.'

Key Information:

- All children in KS2 will get to take part in at least 2 activities.
- Please go through the list of activities with your child and state their top 5 preferences on the attached form.
- Teachers will try their best to give your child activities from their top preferences however places for certain activities are limited and will be given on a first come first served basis.
- Some activities are off school premises. By completing the return slip you are giving permission for your child to attend all activities (on and off school site)
- If your child does not return the form they will be allocated activities where there are spaces by their class teachers but these will only be for 'on school site' activities.

SPORTS ENRICHMENT WEEK 2026 OPTIONS

Sport	What is it?
Boxerdrill	A fun fitness activity where children learn basic boxing skills, coordination, and control in a safe environment.
Indoor Climbing	A sport where children climb walls using strength and problem-solving skills while safely secured with ropes.
Girls Rugby	A team sport where players run, pass, and work together to score tries by carrying the ball over the line.
Golf Range	An activity where children practice hitting golf balls to improve accuracy and distance.
Boccia	A gentle target sport where players throw or roll balls to get as close as possible to a marker ball.
Skateboarding and Bouldering	A balance-based activity where children learn to ride and perform simple tricks on a skateboard and bouldering is a type of climbing on low walls without ropes, focusing on strength, balance, and problem-solving.
Gaelic Football	A fast-paced team sport combining kicking, catching, and running with the ball to score points.
Ultimate Frisbee	A non-contact team sport where players pass a flying disc to teammates to score in an end zone.
Lacrosse	A team sport where players use a stick to catch, carry, and pass a ball to score goals.
Fencing	A sport where players use safe swords to score points by touching their opponent while following rules and technique.
