Thank you for supporting your child with their learning at home during these challenging times.
Here is some guidance to explain what we would like to see and hopefully help you to support your child:

- ❖ All learning will be on Class Dojo, if you are having difficulty accessing Class Dojo, please contact the school office as soon as possible.
- ❖ Class teachers will post links daily on Dojo 'Class Story' or Dojo 'Messages' for you to access along with explanations for how to complete the work set. These will be posted by 9am. There may be clips uploaded to support you further.
- ❖ Class teachers will be teaching in school but if you wish to send a message to the teacher via Class Dojo, they will be available from 9.30am until 3.00pm and they will respond to the messages as soon as possible.
- ❖ We expect all children to complete all work tasks daily.
- ❖ All children are aware of classroom expectations ie. producing enough work, neat handwriting, clear answers, punctuating their writing.
- ❖ Teachers will feedback daily and they may suggest tips for your child to improve their work, as they would in school.
- ❖ To help teachers read your child's work on screen please only photograph one piece of work at a time and send it to your teacher via 'Messages'.
- ❖ Teachers will share some examples of good work from both home and school, this will remind children of the expectations in the classroom.
- ❖ We will check in with you and your child weekly, in order to feedback on work and we will contact you if we have concern about the quality of work your child is doing
- ❖ The compulsory 3 hours a day for KS1 and 4 hours a day for KS2 as directed from the government, does not have to follow the school timings, however it is helpful for your child to have a consistent routine.
- ❖ We will be constantly reviewing home learning and teachers welcome your feedback.

Thank you for your continuing support during these challenging times. We look forward to seeing you back in school when it is safe to do so.
